This play has been with IAMA since its inception in our Basecamp new play lab, and we are so proud to bring this frighteningly funny, timely new work from the page to the stage.

In December, our New Works Festival returns in a newly expanded version, thanks to a generous award from the National Endowment for the Arts. This year's festival will feature staged readings of eight new plays, along with additional compensation to the artists and reduced ticket prices for the public.

Then in 2025, we are excited to present two workshop productions: DON'T TOUCH MY HAIR by Douglas Lyons and TRAUMA PLAY by Abigail Miller. With this new workshop model, we invite you, our audiences, into a space somewhere between the rehearsal room and opening night, where we can all be a part of what it means to develop a new play.

And finally, this season IAMA is also represented on Broadway with two shows developed though our pipleline: JOB THE PLAY by Max Wolf Friedlich, which was written in IAMA's Emerging Playwrights Lab, and CULT OF LOVE by Leslye Headland, which had its world premiere at IAMA in 2018. CULT OF LOVE is the final play in Headland's Seven Deadly Plays cycle, which all world premiered at IAMA.

We are committed to creating an even stronger pipeline for our artists and celebrating that process with you, our community. Thank you for being an essential part of our process!

PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

I began writing this play in the winter of 2020. I, like so many, had been sparring with family and childhood friends on the virtual battlefield that is Facebook over issues both political and social, where misinformation and memes could buttress the structure of dubious "truths". Then suddenly, Qanon ideology linked to partisan violence intensified, and I began to be physically threatened by people I had known for decades. The threats were specific and detailed. I was privately warned about the violence I would encounter if I returned home, and that no one would save me when the civil war came. I thought, why not write a play about these people getting to act out their violent fantasies?

I finished my first draft on January 5th, 2021. The next day, many of the people I was writing about were at the capital playing out their fantasies In Real Life. Tonight, with the help of IAMA, The Inkwell Theatre, and my frequent collaborator Melissa Coleman-Reed, I too carry out my fantasy of resistance.

I wrote this play hoping to make sense of where I come from, the contradiction of my "home" to where my heart lives now. I hope it is both a call to action and healing, rather than simply polarizing further. I hope that as you watch it, you will both laugh very hard and think about the very thin line between hypothetical violence and physical violence. We all have met the very best people in our lives, but I don't think we get a chance to meditate on how dangerous they really are, and how willing to carry out their plans. - JL

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Three years ago, John Lavelle shared with me that he had new pages for a play based on true events from his experiences of 2020. He sent them, I started reading, stopped cold after twenty pages, and walked away. This world was too charged/raw/frightening. I had to simply breathe after the lightning bolt discovery that this place, this bar, is not a space for me.

Stepping back in, I understood this fly-on-the-wall sensation he's crafted for us, allowing the people of this play to be their fullest-truest selves, inviting us to witness a truth that thrives behind some closed doors, especially when you are not wanted or welcome.

John's aim at creating an anti-racist play that does not feature Folx of Color, sparked me. The true ignition point for me in this piece is RAGE. Very specifically, rage in white men of all ages, that goes unchecked, unexamined, and which is ultimately protected and so often celebrated.

Sitting inside this world, I hope for us, the discovery of a feeling of reaching out to find each other in the darkness as we negotiate a world that twists on a dime, reveals ugly truths, and often hurts to be in. How do we hold on, stand up, link arms, push forward. Good works only exist with real action. I'm thrilled to continue this fantastic journey with John, Stef and IAMA. 
